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Under Construction

As we embrace the change of season, our construction team keeps on building. Here's an update on what they've been digging into.

For the first time in our affiliate's history, we are working with three different architects at three simultaneous build sites: Terrapin Architecture at Eddy Street, Guy Hupy Design at East Eugene Street, and Studio STL at Cliff Street.

We are nearly finished with both single-family homes on **Eddy Street** in Port Townsend. Excitement is building for both families who are soon to move in. Also excited are our partners who have been assigned the two four-

bedroom homes on **East Eugene Street** in Irondale. We're completing finishing work on one, while the other is close behind. Permitting is done and initial infrastructure has been installed at our **Cliff Cottages** site in Port Townsend. This means power, water, and sewer lines have been established through the property. Construction is just starting, but we are excited to preserve the stand of mature trees that connects to adjacent woodlands on the property.

Habitat Selects Fairbank for Mason Street

Habitat for Humanity of East Jefferson County has chosen Fairbank Construction of Bainbridge Island as the general contractor for the Mason Street neighborhood, a 150-unit affordable housing community in Port Hadlock. The selection followed a thorough assessment by Habitat and

CapEx Advisory Group, with input from Schemata Workshop, the project's architect.

Fairbank Construction's experience, including work on Quimper Village and prior local engagement, along with their alignment with Habitat for Humanity's mission, were key factors in their selection. This partnership aims to leverage combined expertise and strong relationships necessary for the project's success.
